A Critical Need: Cancer remains a leading cause of death among Hispanics, representing 20% of deaths in this demographic. Despite lower diagnosis rates for common cancers compared to non-Hispanic Whites, Hispanic populations face higher risks for liver, stomach, and cervical cancers. In El Paso County alone, over 16,000 cases of invasive cancer were reported between 2016 and 2020, according to the Texas Cancer Registry.
